Graduation Requirements:

Students must achieve the following grade point averages for graduation:

- a Texas State GPA of 2.00
- a Major GPA of 2.25
- and a Minor GPA of 2.00

Comments

To graduate from Texas State University, students are required to earn a minimum of 36 advanced hours.

^ The minimum number of hours required for this degree program is 120. The number of free elective hours a student will complete depends on the number of hours a student may need to achieve the required 120 total or 36 advanced hours.

This transfer pathway is for planning purposes only, students should seek regular academic advising and consult the undergraduate catalog to ensure they remain on track to satisfy all degree requirements.

Repeating Courses: A course taken for transfer credit must be repeated as transfer credit to count as a repeat. When a course is taken more than once from a transfer institution, the second grade (first repeat) and all subsequent grades (repeats) are included in computing the Overall hours attempted, grade points earned and GPA.
