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**Remaining Coursework for TXST B.G.S**

*A combination of courses in the major, minor, and support program area specified by the appropriate academic department and restricted upper-division courses are required for the B.G.S.*

*To ensure compliance with the course requirements for a B.G.S. degree, students should follow the general sequence of courses specified for the curriculum in the section of the catalog that pertains to their major. Students must select a minor from the approved list of Undergraduate Minors (see University Catalog for options).*

**Graduation Requirements:**

*Students must achieve the following grade point averages for graduation:*

- *a Texas State GPA of 2.00*
- *a Major GPA of 2.25*
- *and a Minor GPA of 2.00*

(The number of open electives will vary based on the number of hours transferred for the AS degree. Students should seek academic advising for confirmation of exact number of hours needed to reach 36 advanced hours and 120 total hours).

**Comments**

To graduate from Texas State University, students are required to earn a minimum of 36 advanced hours.

<sup>^</sup> The minimum number of hours required for this degree program is 120. The number of free elective hours a student will complete depends on the number of hours a student may need to achieve the required 120 total or 36 advanced hours.

**Repeating Courses:** A course taken for transfer credit must be repeated as transfer credit to count as a repeat. When a course is taken more than once from a transfer institution, the second grade (first repeat) and all subsequent grades (repeats) are included in computing the Overall hours attempted, grade points earned and GPA.
