Sam Houston State University be authorized to offer a Doctor of Physical Therapy, housed in the Department of Physical Therapy, within the College of Health Sciences with an implementation date of September 1, 2027, upon final approval by the TSUS Board of Regents and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board.

Explanation

The proposed, 106 semester credit hour (SCH), Doctor of Physical Therapy program offers a uniquely integrated approach combining four distinct clinical education experiences (ranging from 8-10 weeks each) with innovative Integrated Clinical Experiences throughout all three years, providing students with more extensive real-world exposure than typical programs. The proposed Doctor of Physical Therapy program's emphasis on hands-on learning and collaborative practice ensures graduates enter the workforce with superior clinical readiness and professional confidence.

In Texas, 13 institutions offer a Doctor of Physical Therapy program under the proposed CIP Code 51.2308 Physical Therapy/Therapist, with more than half (53.8%) of the competing programs predominately trending positively year-over-year. The ten-year projections (2024-2034) for Physical Therapy target occupations in Texas are projected to increase 23.8%, surpassing the national average growth rate of 18.1%. Furthermore, unlike a Ph.D. in Physical Therapy, the proposed Doctor of Physical Therapy professional doctorate program will be a direct pathway with a clear career trajectory into physical therapy practice. When examining Texas job posting trends for Physical Therapists over the past three years (2022-2025), 431 unique postings require a Doctor of Physical Therapy, compared to 248 unique postings that require a PhD in Physical Therapy. The posting intensity, or employer demand, is also higher for the Doctor of Physical Therapy with a 5:1 posting intensity with 67 employers competing, compared to a PhD in Physical Therapy with a 4:1 posting intensity and 22 employers competing.

In addition, a comprehensive survey conducted among current College of Health Sciences undergraduate students (N=56) demonstrates overwhelming support and interest in establishing a Doctor of Physical Therapy program with 78% of respondents expressing a *very strong interest* in pursuing a career in physical therapy, and 85% of surveyed students indicating they would *seriously consider applying* to a Doctor of Physical Therapy program at Sam Houston State University.

Upon completion of the proposed Doctor of Physical Therapy degree program, students will be able to:

- 1. Provide evidence-based, patient-centered care that promotes optimal function and quality of life for all patient populations.
- 2. Deliver individualized care with professional respect and clinical effectiveness and promote positive outcomes in every interaction.
- 3. Build meaningful connections with patients, families, and colleagues through empathy, integrity, and ethical practice.

- 4. Work effectively as part of interdisciplinary teams to provide coordinated, high-quality healthcare.
- 5. Apply advanced technologies and emerging trends to enhance clinical outcomes and patient experiences.
- 6. Demonstrate a continuous pursuit of personal and professional growth through reflection, education, and engagement with the evolving field.
- 7. Lead initiatives that address healthcare disparities, promote prevention, and improve population health.
- 8. Conduct, evaluate, and apply research to advance knowledge and improve practice.

Explanation

Mr. James S. Taylor, a distinguished business leader and global strategist, has dedicated his career to fostering cross-border economic development, advancing public policy, and supporting higher education.

Born in Texas in 1958 and raised in Ciudad Victoria, Mexico, Mr. Taylor earned a Bachelor of Arts in International Studies from Texas State University in 1981. As a student, he was active in Sigma Delta Pi, Kappa Alpha Order, and the Gold Star Society. He was recognized in Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities. He later completed the Executive Education Program at Stanford Graduate School of Business.

Mr. Taylor began his career as a professor of International Politics at Universidad Autónoma de Tamaulipas before serving as head of International Tourism for the Ministry of Economic and Tourist Development of Tamaulipas. He later worked as Special Assistant for Hispanic Affairs and Mexico Relations to United States Senator Lloyd Bentsen and as Chief of Staff to the Commissioner of the U.S. International Trade Commission. In 1991, he transitioned to the private sector as Vice President at Burson-Marsteller.

In 1992, Mr. Taylor founded Public Strategies, Inc., pioneering a public affairs model that applied political campaign strategies to corporate initiatives. After exiting the firm in 2004, he launched CIMA Strategies Ltd., a Mexico-based consultancy specializing in law enforcement technologies. He co-founded ViaNova, a strategic advisory firm serving clients at the intersection of business, policy, and politics. ViaNova has advised major organizations, including AT&T, NASA, MD Anderson Cancer Network, the NBA, and Bank of America. Mr. Taylor also co-founded Grupo Compadres, LLC, an Austin-Oaxaca-based partnership producing SUSTO Mezcal, a women-owned enterprise rooted in cultural heritage and entrepreneurship.

Mr. Taylor's leadership extends to civic and cultural engagement. He serves on the board of Austin PBS and has supported numerous nonprofits, including CARITAS of Austin and the Tomás Rivera Policy Institute. In 2001, he was named a Distinguished Citizen of Ciudad Victoria. In 2018, the Spanish government appointed him as the first Honorary Consul of Spain in Austin, where he facilitated economic and cultural ties between Spain and Central Texas.

A proud Texas State University alumnus, Mr. Taylor received the College of Liberal Arts Distinguished Alumni Achievement Award in 2017 and was named a Distinguished Alumnus in 2020. He has served on the Texas State Development Foundation Board, including terms as vice chair and chair, and is a current member of the Wittliff Collections Advisory Council.

Through his visionary leadership in business, diplomacy, and education, Mr. Taylor exemplifies the values of global engagement, innovation, and service that this honorary degree seeks to honor.

Explanation

Mr. Mark K. Updegrove, an acclaimed presidential historian, author, and media executive, has dedicated his career to chronicling and interpreting the American presidency while advancing civic education and public discourse.

Born in Abington, Pennsylvania, Mr. Updegrove attended George School, where he later received the Distinguished Alumnus Award (2015). He earned his degree from the University of Maryland, College Park. His early career included leadership roles in media and publishing with Time, Newsweek, Nickelodeon, MTV, and Yahoo. During this period, he published his first book, *Second Acts: Presidential Lives and Legacies After the White House* (2006).

In 2009, Mr. Updegrove was appointed Director of the Lyndon Baines Johnson Presidential Library and Museum. Over the course of eight years, he oversaw major exhibitions, educational programming, and archival stewardship. He hosted the historic 2014 Civil Rights Summit, commemorating the 50th anniversary of the Civil Rights Act, featuring President Barack Obama and former Presidents George W. Bush, Bill Clinton, and Jimmy Carter, alongside civil rights leaders such as John Lewis and Andrew Young. During his tenure, he authored *Baptism by Fire* (2009), *Indomitable Will* (2012), and *The Last Republicans* (2017), based on exclusive interviews with Presidents George H.W. Bush and George W. Bush.

In 2018, Mr. Updegrove became President and CEO of the Lyndon Baines Johnson Foundation, supporting the LBJ Library and the LBJ School of Public Affairs at The University of Texas at Austin. He has since published *Incomparable Grace: JFK in the Presidency* (2022) and *Make Your Mark: Lessons in Character from Seven Presidents* (2025). He also serves as the presidential historian for ABC News and appears regularly on CNN and MSNBC. His media work includes executive producing CNN's LBJ: Triumph and Tragedy (2022) and hosting PBS's Live From the LBJ Library with Mark Updegrove (2024).

Mr. Updegrove has contributed to leading publications, including The New York Times, Politico, Texas Monthly, and Time. He lectures widely at universities such as Harvard University, Rice University, and the University of Virginia, and co-teaches "The Johnson Years" at The University of Texas at Austin. He is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and the Philosophical Society of Texas.

Mr. Updegrove's long-standing relationship with Texas State University includes delivering the 2019 commencement address, participating in the LBJ Distinguished Lecture Series, and contributing to Hillviews magazine. His scholarship and leadership have deepened the understanding of presidential history and advanced the legacy of President Lyndon B. Johnson, whose transformative years began at Texas State.

Through his distinguished career as a historian, author, educator, and civic leader, Mr. Updegrove exemplifies the values of scholarship, public service, and engagement that this honorary degree seeks to honor.

Mr. Sergio L. Rodriguez, a native of Alice, Texas, and long-time Austin resident, is an accomplished business leader and philanthropist dedicated to advancing educational opportunities for first-generation college students.

Mr. Rodriguez earned a Bachelor of Arts in Architecture from Princeton University and a Master of Business Administration from the University of Michigan's Stephen M. Ross School of Business. His early career included serving as an owner's representative for the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, D.C., where he coordinated design and construction efforts leading to the museum's opening. He later spent two decades with CGI Technologies and Solutions, managing large-scale IT systems integration projects for government and commercial clients worldwide.

In 2015, Mr. Rodriguez became Vice President of GALO OPS, LLC, a family enterprise managing ranching operations and mineral rights across South Texas. This business was built by his great-aunt and uncle, Gloria and Hector López, whose success in ranching, real estate, and oil and gas laid the foundation for transformative philanthropy.

In 2017, the Hector and Gloria López Foundation (HGLF) was established to honor the legacy of Hector and Gloria López. Under Mr. Rodriguez's leadership as President and CEO, HGLF has become a leading advocate for first-generation college students in Texas. The foundation partners with universities to provide full scholarships and comprehensive support, including housing, mentorship, tutoring, and paid internships, assuring students graduate debt-free and prepared for leadership roles. To date, HGLF has awarded millions in grants to institutions such as Texas A&M University-Kingsville, The University of Texas at San Antonio, The University of Texas at El Paso, St. Mary's University, University of the Incarnate Word, Our Lady of the Lake University, St. Edward's University, Texas A&M University-San Antonio, and Texas A&M International University.

In 2023, HGLF partnered with Texas State University to launch the López Scholars, a \$1.79 million initiative supporting 15 first-generation students annually for five years. This program prioritizes opportunities over traditional metrics, empowering students from diverse backgrounds to achieve academic and professional success.

Beyond his philanthropic work, Mr. Rodriguez serves on the Board of Trustees at St. Edward's University. He is a member of the Austin Area Research Organization and the Philosophical Society of Texas. He has previously served on the boards of Austin PBS, Austin Community Foundation, Breakthrough Central Texas, and Con Mi MADRE. He has also acted as a mentor for The New Philanthropists.

Through his leadership, vision, and commitment to education, Mr. Rodriguez has created pathways for countless students to achieve intergenerational mobility and become future leaders and philanthropists.

In light of recent statutory and governance updates prompted by passage of *Senate Bill 37 (89th Texas Legislature, 2025)*, each component institution has proposed a new set of Faculty Senate/Council bylaws to ensure alignment with current legal and policy frameworks. These bylaws were reviewed and approved by the respective Chief Academic Officer/Provost and President, and subsequently reviewed by the Vice Chancellor for Academic and Health Affairs and the Vice Chancellor and General Counsel to confirm consistency with System policies, applicable laws, and governance requirements.

The bylaws for each institution establish faculty-only membership, representation parameters, advisory scope, officer appointments by the president, and meeting procedures consistent with Board policy. Approval of this motion will formalize the faculty senates' advisory structures across all component institutions, ensuring compliance with System governance standards, *Senate Bill 37 (2025)* provisions, and the TSUS Rules and Regulations.

The Emmett and Miriam McCoy College of Business Administration Development Foundation (Foundation) is approved by the IRS as an independent 501c.3 nonprofit corporation that serves exclusively for the benefit of the McCoy College of Business (College). By Regental agreement, the Foundation is the primary recipient and fiscal manager of major gifts to McCoy College.

During fiscal year ending August 31, 2025, the McCoy College of Business Foundation received \$866,989.24 in cash contributions and remitted to the University \$2,386,816.53 for the support of McCoy College in the form of scholarships and fellowships as well as student, faculty, program, and research support.

The Foundation currently manages 165 endowments with a fair market value totaling \$85,745,403.36.

Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Justice Programs, NIJ Grant FY21 Research and Evaluation on Policing,	The Department of Justice-Office of Justice Programs conducted a comprehensive programmatic monitoring review of the grant titled "Improving Investigations and Community Relations Through the Training of Evidence-Based Interviewing Skills in Frontline Officers," administered by the School of Criminal Justice. This grant totals \$497,785 and covers the period from March 2022 through December 2025. The review encompassed contract award monitoring and oversight of financial, administrative, and programmatic activities. Key objectives included verifying compliance with all applicable regulations and award conditions, assessing programmatic progress, validating reported information, and providing technical assistance for ongoing grant management. The review determined that the grant is progressing as outlined in the approved application and remains fully compliant with Federal, Office of Justice Programs (OJP), and Program Office requirements. No exceptions or reportable conditions were identified during the review.
May 2025 Texas Department of Agriculture (TDA) Review of the Child and Adult Care Food Program – Child Care Center Program (CACFP- CCC) at TXST, June 2025	The TDA performed a review of the Child and Adult Care Food Program – Child Care Center (CACFP-CCC) at TXST to assess the University's compliance with federal and state regulations. The review included an evaluation of CACFP records for one selected month and a review of financial documentation for the Program Year 2024 (October 1, 2023 – September 30, 2024). During this period, the CACFP-CCC program reported expenditure totaling \$74,173 for food and related non-food costs. The review identified several minor areas of noncompliance with federal and state rules and regulations. Since the meal allowances identified during the review totaled only \$5.54, the TDA disregarded the amount, and an adjusted claim or repayment of the CACFP funds is not required. The minor discrepancies identified during the review were as follows: Of the 95 enrollment forms examined, 2 forms were missing enrollment dates and 6 forms did not indicate hours of care. For the reimbursement month reviewed, the eligibility count by meal category was inaccurate by one Free meal, one Reduced meal, and two Paid meals. This discrepancy appeared to result from a clerical error in transferring data from the roster to the claim. The reported meal counts for reimbursement were off by two meals for both Lunch (1,261 meals) and PM Snack (1,237 meals) during the mon reviewed.
	The Child Development Center developed and submitted a Corrective Action Plan (CAP) to address these findings. The TDA reviewed and approved the CAP, confirming that the proposed actions will resolve the areas of noncompliance. The review is now considered closed.

Explanation

Sam Houston State University currently charges a fee of \$50 per semester credit hour for dual credit courses taught by an SHSU instructor. This motion removes that additional fee while maintaining the designated tuition rate of \$50 per semester credit hour for all dual credit courses. This adjustment simplifies the billing process, promotes consistency across partner schools, and strengthens SHSU's competitive position in the regional dual credit market.

SHSU's dual credit program serves as both a community engagement initiative and a strategic recruitment tool that extends the university's reach into surrounding school districts. Establishing and maintaining partnerships with local high schools reinforces SHSU's brand recognition and creates a pathway for students to continue their education at the university.

Research indicates that students who participate in dual enrollment are more likely to pursue higher education, earn higher first-year GPAs, and graduate more quickly and at higher rates than their peers.

Tuition for workforce continuing education courses offered for CEUs must be established by the institution's governing board.

The institution's Board may delegate interim authority for establishment of tuition. However, the institution's Board must at least annually ratify or approve any changes in tuition.

Delegation authority was authorized by the Board of Regents at the November 2024 Board of Regents Meeting for the 2024-2025 academic year.





BUILDING PERFORMANCE/SUSTAINABILITY EVALUATION OR GENERAL COMMENTS

The project incorporates SECO and ASHRAE 90.1 requirements for mechanical efficiencies and utilizes low-flow plumbing fixtures. Energy efficient LED lighting is used throughout the building. Acoustically, wall, floor and ceiling systems have been designed to limit the transfer of noise between spaces. Skylights were incorporated along the central corridor to provide natural day lighting.

The projects listed below are proposed to be placed on the 2026-2031 Capital Improvements Program (CIP) so that they may proceed without delay.

Football Locker Room Renovation – Lamar University

Scope of the Project: Upgrades and improvements to the home team football locker room in the Dauphin Center. The scope includes new ventilated lockers, the addition of a sauna, lighting improvements, new graphics, and a new field entrance for the team.

Background Information: The Dauphin Center was constructed in 2010. The existing locker room is original to the building and is starting to show signs of wear. The room needs additional ventilation to improve hygienic conditions and the addition of a sauna will enhance the existing training facilities.

Estimated Total Project Cost: \$2,500,000

as provided below.

Funding Source(s): The project funding source will be designated funds.

Faculty Housing - Sul Ross State University

Scope of the Project: The project will construct up to eight faculty and staff housing units on University owned land in Alpine, Texas, including a proposal for four 2-bedroom/2-bath homes and four 3-bedroom/2-bath homes. The project scope includes necessary site development of all needed utilities, roadways, and minimal landscaping.

Background Information: A portion of the proposed university owned land previously housed 13 duplexes obtained from a military base at the close of World War II. Those duplexes have since been removed although remnants of their original location remain. Adjacent and to the south of this site is an undeveloped 4 acre property proposed for the new housing. A site evaluation will determine any present utility infrastructure and improvements needed to make land ready for the construction of the new homes.

Estimated Total Project Cost: \$2,500,000

Funding Source(s): The project funding source will be from debt financed, repaid by housing revenues.

Centennial Hall - Room 157 Renovations - Texas State University

This project is being added to the 2026 CIP since the total project cost is anticipated to exceed the \$2M threshold.

Scope of the Project: This project involves a comprehensive renovation of Teaching Theater 157 in Centennial Hall. Key upgrades include a modern audiovisual system, replacement of all fixed seating, installation of new carpeting, acoustic wall panels, and fresh paint. Additionally, the project will reconfigure the theater's entry and lobby area.

Background Information: Teaching Theater 157 is a high-traffic instructional space that has experienced significant wear over time. Many of the fixed seats are damaged beyond repair, and the existing rear-projection AV system is outdated and no longer serviceable. The planned lobby reconfiguration will improve circulation and accessibility, enhancing the overall experience for students entering and exiting the theater.

Estimated Total Project Cost: \$3,500,000

Funding Source(s): The project funding source will be from HEF.

<u>Satellite Parking Lot – Texas State University</u>

This project is being added to the 2026 CIP since the total project cost is anticipated to exceed the \$2M threshold.

Scope of the Project: This project will construct a new 800-space surface parking lot near the Materials Management Warehouse at 1101 Carlson Circle in San Marcos.

Background Information: With continued enrollment growth, additional parking is needed to accommodate students, faculty, staff, and visitors.

Estimated Total Project Cost: \$5,760,000

Funding Source(s): The project funding will be from 'Auxiliary or Unexpended' sources.

1.(16) Attorney General Requests. Explanation

The proposed change to our system rule is intended to reflect our actual process when making a request to the Texas Attorney General's Office for a decision under the Public Information Act versus a request for an opinion from the Texas Attorney General's office. A request for a decision is different than a request for an opinion and the new rule conveys this distinction by segregating the two processes and clarifying the administrators who may request a Attorney General decision versus an Attorney General opinion.

CHAPTER VI. STUDENT SERVICES AND ACTIVITIES

13. REGENTS' STUDENT SCHOLAR AWARD.

- Purpose. The honorary title, Regents' <u>Student</u> Scholar, recognizes students who achieve excellence in academic and co-curricular endeavors at Component institutions.
- Process. Not later than <u>July 15</u> <u>August 31</u> of each year, the President of each Component may nominate to the Chancellor one outstanding student. Upon the recommendation of the Chancellor, the <u>Texas State University System Foundation</u> <u>Board of Directors Board of Regents</u> may bestow each year the title of "Regents' <u>Student</u> Scholar" upon a select student or students who have demonstrated the following:
 - (1) Outstanding academic achievement and scholarship in his/her studies;
 - (2) Strong commitment to and leadership in co-curricular activities; and,
 - (3) Notable contributions to the Component institution and community.

At the time of graduation, a Regents' <u>Student</u> Scholar <u>may</u> shall be recognized at his/her Component institution's commencement ceremonies.

- 13.3 Eligibility. To be considered for selection, at a minimum, a student must have a 3.75 cumulative GPA, be enrolled full-time at a Component institution, and have earned 25 semester credit hours (for 2-year institutions) or 60 semester credit hours (for 4-year institutions). Additionally, the student must demonstrate active involvement in co-curricular campus and leadership activities, and not have been on academic or disciplinary probation at any time while attending the Component institution.
- 13.4 Benefits of Award. Award of such a title shall be accompanied by passage of a resolution by the Board of Regents, memorialized in the minutes of the meeting at which it was awarded, and the issuance of a commemorative medallion. A cash award scholarship from the Texas State University System Foundation payable to the Component institution for use by the student toward fees, textbooks, and other educational expenses, including but not limited to, lodging, dining, and parking may shall be awarded. The Chancellor and the Executive Director of the Foundation would determine in advance the amount of the scholarship.

Explanation

The proposed changes update the name and selection process of the award to align with current practice. In 2017, the Board of Directors of the Texas State University System Foundation


(Foundation) updated the Regents' Scholar Award to align the name and selection process with other existing award programs recognizing faculty and staff: (1) changing the name from "Regents' Scholar" to "Regents' Student Scholar"; (2) assigning responsibility for selecting winners to the Foundation Board of Directors; and (3) changing application and nomination deadlines. Additionally, in 2025, the Foundation Board of Directors changed the award from a scholarship to a cash prize to allow winners who receive other forms of financial aid to realize the full benefit of the award.






Location of the Traditional Public Forum on the San Marcos Camus


Location of the Traditional Public Forum on the Round Rock Campus


