1 A Resolution-

- 2 To be known as "A Resolution to Emphasize Student Need for In-
- 3 Person Course Offerings." Relating to the current issue of a
- 4 high number of classes being offered solely online."
- 5 WHEREAS: The Student Government of Texas State University, on
- 6 behalf of the student body, would like to address students' needs
- 7 and requests for assured in-person class options; and,
- 8 WHEREAS: A significant portion of students have expressed concern
- 9 over the number of courses offered exclusively online, resulting
- 10 in limited access to in-person learning opportunities; and,
- 11 WHEREAS: Texas State University has an existing policy and
- 12 expressed expectation that courses with an online/hybrid section
- 13 should offer at least one in-person section, yet this standard has
- 14 not been consistently upheld across departments; and,

- 15 WHEREAS: Student Government understands that certain exceptions
- 16 need to be made for courses that feature a niche topic area taught
- 17 by a faculty member who is not present in the San Marcos area, yet
- 18 it is evident through student feedback that online-only options
- 19 are not being confined to this rare circumstance; and,
- 20 WHEREAS: Though students should be allowed to choose online
- 21 sections of their courses, the keyword is 'choose'. When Colleges
- 22 and Departments restrict in-person class availability, they
- 23 deprive students of opportunities and confine them to a learning
- 24 style that may not accurately reflect their ideal educational
- 25 environment. As a university striving for academic greatness,
- 26 higher GPAs, and retention rates, we must promote an environment
- 27 that gives students the autonomy to select class types that best
- 28 suit their needs; and,
- 29 WHEREAS: Evidence has shown that online courses result in lower
- 30 academic achievement, a lessened sense of belonging, and overall
- 31 worse student performance. Thus, it is in the best interest of the
- 32 university to provide students with more in-person course options
- 33 and ensure they are not restricted to online learning; and,
- 34 WHEREAS: The procedure to bypass this standard or obtain an
- 35 exception to the mandate for in-person courses should go through
- 36 the Provost's office each time it is requested. Without oversight

- 37 from another department, students may find themselves paying
- 38 tuition for an in-person degree that they are earning online; and,
- 39 WHEREAS: Students should not have to pay online class fees when
- 40 they were not given the option to take it in person; therefore,
- 41 BE IT RESOLVED: The Student Government of Texas State University
- 42 formally requests that departments and colleges uphold and enforce
- 43 the policy requiring that online courses must also provide an in-
- 44 person section; and,
- 45 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: This legislation be forwarded to the
- 46 Student Body President for further action.
