

## **Omega Leo Medical Explorer Job Description Equestrian Therapy Liaison**

Our Equestrian Therapy liaison is helps with communication between area equestrian therapy program and our Medical Explorer membership. You should ask for an opportunity to encourage our Medical Explorer membership to volunteer with Equestrian Therapy programs. You are the “cheerleader” for Equestrian Therapy and the value of this experience to anyone seeking to become a Physician Therapist, Pediatrician, or Rehab Physician. Ask for time during our regular weekly meeting to promote equestrian therapy volunteer opportunities and be prepared to share stories about your experiences.

You should keep up with Medical Explorers who may be volunteering with any area equestrian therapy program and ask them to submit reports of their volunteering on their Medical Explorer resume and Spreadsheet of Volunteer Hours.

You submit a monthly report of Medical Explorers volunteering in Equestrian Therapy programs and accumulate the information for a Fall and Spring semester report, along with an end-of-year report after June 30.

In addition, you should always be informed about training opportunities with details and dates offered by the equestrian therapy program, and help communicate that information to our Medical Explorer membership, our Training Officer, Vice president of Operations, and Senior Advisor to be included on our medical explorer semester schedule.

Be available to answer questions and assist Medical Explorer members who may be interested in Equestrian Therapy volunteering. You should be an active equestrian therapy volunteer yourself.

It is your responsibility to review and update this job description before new officers and liaisons are brought onboard early in the spring semester. You are to also write, review, and update any Standard Operating Procedures related to your position
