**POLLING LOCATION**

From time-to-time areas on the Texas State University’s San Marcos and Round Rock campuses are designated as a polling place for national, state, or local elections. Below are areas designated for the upcoming election:

**2026 JOINT PRIMARY RUN-OFF ELECTION**

**DESIGNATED PLACES FOR SIGNS AND OUTDOOR SPACES FOR ELECTIONEERING**

**Student Involvement & Engagement (SI&E) designates one or more places near the polling place where persons may place signs for or against any candidate, measure, and/or political party.**

- As provided in state law ([Election Code § 62.013](#)), these signs must be at least 100 feet from the outside door through which a voter may enter a building in which a polling place is located.
- The designated areas will be large enough to accommodate a reasonable number of signs.
- To accommodate all signs, SI&E may limit the number of signs that may be placed in the designated areas by a candidate or by the proponents or opponents of a measure being voted on at the polling place.
- Signs may go up 24 hours before voting begins, and signs must be taken down 24 hours after voting has ended.

**No electioneering may occur within 100 feet of an outside door of polling place during Early Voting and Election Day.**

- During the time a polling place on campus is open for voting, a person may not electioneer for or against any candidate, measure, or political party within 100 feet of an outside door through which a voter may enter the building in which an early voting polling place is located.



## ELECTIONEERING GUIDELINES 2026 JOINT PRIMARY RUN-OFF ELECTION

---

- Individuals cannot advertise either by signs, personal belongings, or hold political meetings in the LBJ Student Center (San Marcos Campus) or Avery Building (Round Rock Campus) during early voting days or on Election Day ([Election Code § 85.036](#)).
- Be aware that individuals who do not adhere to the election guidelines will be asked to leave the premises.

### **Candidates and Electioneers may not:**

- disrupt classes or other university activities;
- violate state law or any university policies, including those identified in [UPPS No. 07.04.01 – Expressive Activities](#);
- post signs or electioneer inside university buildings; or
- post messages on campus electronic message boards.

### **ELECTIONEERING REGISTRATION FORM**

To electioneer on Texas State University's campuses, SI&E highly encourages persons or groups to fill out the Electioneering Registration Form. This form is not required.

The completion and submission of this form ensures the following:

- Guarantees designated space for requestor(s).
- Maintains security, health, and safety for people and property on campus.
- Preserves an academic atmosphere. Classes in session and other university activities should not be disrupted. Quiet is necessary in areas assigned for study, social, recreational, and developmental programs.
- Control of pedestrian and vehicular traffic, so that free movement and free entry and exit from university facilities are permitted.
