UNIVERSITY MAY TAKE UP SOCCER

MEETING OF STUDENTS INTER-
ESTED IN THE GAME CALLED
FOR THIS AFTERNOON.

AUSTIN, Tex., Jan. 7.—That soccer
football will become a permanent and im-
portant sport at the University of Texas
is not a remote possibility. A special
meeting of all students interested in the
sport has been called by Prof. W. E. Met-
zenthin, director of physical training for
men in the university, for Wednesday
afternoon. The Houston Highlanders, a
soccer football team of Houston, has
challenged the university for a game and
in all probability a team will be sent
Houston to play the Scotchmen. It is
highly probable that other games may be
arranged for, as there are soccer teams
in Dallas and other Texas cities.

The essential difference between Rugby
football and soccer football is that in the
latter game the players are not allowed
to carry the ball, kicking being the only
means of taking the ball from the center
of the field, where the ball is put in play,
to the losing side's goal line. The game
is very popular in Europe and Canada.
The game has been taken up at the uni-
versity of California and at several of
the Eastern universities and colleges,
where the sport has gained much popu-
larity.

The following subjects have been
chosen by the faculty committee on for-
ensics and oratory for the W. J. Bryan

1. The fee system
2. The need of State supervision of
charitable and correctional institutions
in Texas (county jails, convict farms,
poor farms, private sanitariums, etc.)
3. What steps should the State of
Texas take to promote the public health.
4. Should Texas have a compulsory
education law?
5. Reform of judicial procedure.
6. Compensation to injured workmen
7. The applicability of the principles of
commission government to the county.
8. The need of civil service reform in
Texas.
9. A public utilities commission for
Texas.

The recent death in New York of Harry
Peyton Steger, editor of Short Stories
Magazine and a former student in the
university, is the cause of much regret
in varsity circles. Mr. Steger was born
in Bonham, Tex. While in the university
Mr. Steger received the Rhodes scholar-
ship and, as a consequence, he finished
his education at Oxford College in Eng-
land after obtaining his B.A. degree in
the Texas institution. After returning
to the United States Mr. Steger engaged
in literary work and became critic for
Doubleday, Page & Co. He was a per-
sonal friend of O. Henry, the short story
writer, and after the eccentric author's
death became his literary executor. He
