AUSTIN, Tex., Jan. 7.-That soccer football will become a permanent and important sport at the University of Texas is not a remote possibility. A special meeting of all students interested in the sport has been called by Prof. W. E. Metzenthin, director of physical training for men in the university, for Wednesday afternoon. The Houston Highlanders, a soccer football team of Houston, has challenged the university for a game and in all probability a team will be sent Houston to play the Scotchmen. It is highly probable that other games may be arranged for, as there are soccer teams in Pallas and other Texas cites.

The essential differnce between Rugby football and soccer football is that in the latter game the players are not allowed to carry the ball, kicking being the only means of taking the ball from the center of the field, where the ball is put in play, to the losing side's goal line. The game is very popular in Egrope and Canada. The game has been taken up at the university of California and at several of the Eastern universities and colleges, where the sport has gained much popu-
